> on pies and auction items, and yes even drink tickets, and share some of that money with the Endowment.







for two additional years. It was during this time she met **Jerry Mason**. **Jerry** a pilot with a plane, and **Nohemi** did lots of traveling by air as well as lots of traveling in general.

Nohemi and **Jerry**, on a trip to Copper Canyon, Mexico saw a great need. They brought this need to our Club and support for Copper Canyon happened. With the first matching grant, potable water was brought to some of the small villages deep in the canyon. Multiple trips happened, but sadly because of drug cartels, the emphasis went from personal visits to scholarship emphasis. The Chihuahua Rotary Club has partnered with us and again and matching grants have been quite helpful. **Nohemi** is due another moment with **Marty** because she still has much to share!

World Community Service

On to Phil **Doughtery**, World Community Service. **Phil** discussed International Projects funded. He also described the levels of where to find the money. Club money through Foundation interest and grants, then the magic money, Districted Designated Funds. The more our Club gives, the more Rotary International gives back. Some of the projects have been Copper Canyon Scholars, brought to the Club by **Nohemi**. This year we are providing \$3000 to cover scholarships and food.

Next with **Peian Harness** the lead, is Columbia. We help aid with a music program in Bogata. This after school music program helps keep kids focused and away from the drugs and gun violence of the street. We fund purchasing instruments and paying teachers.

On to Guatamala with lead **Marty Wickenheiser**. Hospital del la Familia sends through a foundation medical teams to deal with surgeries. We support keeping the hospital open with \$1500. **Bill McDill** discussed Boys Town, Davao the Philippines. This is an off-shoot of a former program, the kidney transplant program. This assists indigent street kids while housing them, clothing them, and providing them with skills and training.

Phil also discussed a Uganda Water Project and Project Amigo in Mexico .

Rob Marshall is involved with a Guatemala Clean Water Project that also provides a water bottling system. These projects are completely funded, but in limbo due to Covid.

Also mentioned were Peru, building green houses and Ecuador led by **Holly Axtell**. This involves micro credits, setting up small businesses and then passing that money on to others.

Al Angulo is involved with Ojo De Agua, the theme of clean water and sanitation.

Daryl Scott, ex-Novato Rotarian bought our Club and his Lincoln Club into a project in Chapala, Mexico, again bringing clean water to the population.

Next up, Jim Spilman to summarize Community Service. Among the projects are a number of separate projects: VFW Hall (building a gazebo, a gate, a fence and outdoor carpeting); new blinds at Lynwood School's library; Novato Street Teams receiving 100 care packages, Brick Laying at City Hall (placing names of Novato Mayors and Citizens of the Year): Car Wash Fundraiser to raise money for our teachers; respecting our elders by helping Los Robles Mobile Home residents with upkeep; Blue Star Moms; replacing downtown tree lights with led lights; Helpers and Heros (treating under privileged kids to \$100 each to spend at Target during the holidays), North Bay Childrens Garden of Eden; Novato Youth Center Scholarships; Diaper Drive; Warm Wishes (backpacks for the homeless); scholarships for Novato High School Seniors;, Summer Books (helping kids select books from the Global Book Exchange); and on and on...

Wow we need to be so proud of our Club and the volunteerism of all our members. I apologize for leaving out members involved with all these projects, but this bulletin would have gone on for pages. Last recognition is **Marty Wickenheiser**, 2020 Marin Realtors Community Service Volunteer of the Year. Well deserved **Marty**!!




