Our future President **Christina Stroeh** is going to PET, President Elect Training.




and bank that is used as a toilet, endless piles of garbage and debris vs socially conforming, law abiding nearby business owners and public use and social decency.

The homeless camping in our public Parks are refusing placement. They enjoy the freedom of the Park that the law allows. We also learned from our DA that due to Covid there are only two Covid Safe Court Rooms and there is a Prosecution Case backlog of 200. We also learned the process of selection for releasing San Quentin prisoners due to Covid rules to provide safer single occupied cells.
