On a cold Saint Patrick's morning we masked up and put on layers to continue a decade long Novato City Hall project that has a growing patio of engraved bricks that covers the history of Novato and it's growth naming the civic leaders of our town. Novato resident **Elayne Miller**, who lives across the street from City Hall, organized a Purchase a Brick project in 2008 for \$100 with brief engraving.

Past Mayor Jeanne MacLeamy furthered the project that coincided with the massive building renovation of turning the original First Presbyterian Church of Novato into a City Hall conference room while maintaining the original exterior of the church architecture adding the City of Novato's crowing rooster logo on top of steeple. The entire church was elevated for a new foundation and the building was moved several feet away from the street. A buried time capsule was discovered and replaced for opening on the 100th birthday of Novato incorporation, 2040.

The City Hall brick patio of engraved bricks is the history of this area preceding the Miwok indigenous first people and leaders and donors to the present. Three Rotary Club past presidents, Citizens of the Year and Mayors are named on the bricks. You can walk through time from the front to around the building. As citizens donate the history grows. You have to stand on the Patio to appreciate the impact.

With forethought and organization, a labor force was needed to remove blank bricks to be replaced with engraved bricks. Members of three Novato Rotary Clubs have provided a willing crew, repeatedly.


