John traveled to Ukraine six times to help direct the formation of a country wide child Polio Vaccination Program in Ukraine.

In 2015 **John** explained to me the need and challenge of communicating with high levels of a corrupt government about vaccination as preventative medicine to save the children while under Ukraine seated Russian billionaire oligarchy privatizing the country for personal gain.

By approximately 2016, Ukraine invited **Dr. John Ellowa**y to receive an honorary thank you to him

The Speaker

Guest Speaker **Drew McIntyre**, Manager the North Marin Water District was introduced by **President Chris DeGabriele** (former Manager of NMWD).

Drew has 35 years of public and private water systems experience. He was with the NMWD as Chief Engineer and has lived in Novato 30 years, and is a member of Rotary Sunrise.

His Zoom share of graphs told a very clear picture of the situation we face in the possibly approaching historic year of drought. NMWD serves 20,645 connections of 61,640 people. Our water supply is in man made Stafford Lake, Lake Mendocino and Lake Sonoma via Russian River.

Rob Marshall and **Sonia Seeman** endorsed the residential internet monitoring of water use, available due to a \$6 million transition to electronic meter reading.

Study the graph photos to understand the situation followed by the oncoming drought regulations. Interesting to note is the Southern part of Marin, The Marin Municipal Water District gets Sonoma Lake water through our water pipes.

ROTARY ALERT 3/29/21:

We lost a great friend of Rotary on Friday March 26th. Dr. John Elloway was a dedicated and highly recognized member of the Rotary Club of Novato for 50 years He served as our President in 1990-91. Dr. John was honored with the District 5150 Rotarian of the year for 1993 and was the awarded the highest Rotary "Service Above Self Award in 1995 for his extraordinary efforts to organize and help immunized millions of children in the country of Ukraine against the scourge of Polio.

Dr. John was the D5150 World Community Service Chair in 1993-94. He was the organizer and Project Chair of Ukraine Immunization of a Rotary 3-H Project (\$500,000) and worked with our Rotary Foundation, Centers for Disease Control (CDC), US Aid, World Bank, with three of the Ukraine Ministers of Health and later the Bill and Linda Gates Foundation in developing a country wide health system in Ukraine.

In the process of over 30 trips to the Ukraine and other countries Dr. John helped found and support many Rotary clubs. He paid for and delivered many thousands of the booklet "An Ounce of Prevention" in English and had it translated into the various traveled country's languages.

Dr. John lectured to physicians and medical personal in many countries on preventing heart attacks, eating healthy diets and lifestyles. He also helped organize Lifestyle Centers across the county of Ukraine and started an English and a computer school in the county of Tajikistan.

Dr. John supported and served as the President of the Nova Ro Corporation, the owner of our three Senior Housing Projects.

Dr. John and Maryann are Major Donors of the Rotary Foundation and contributors to our Novato Rotary Endowment. In addition to his many professional awards and service to many other nonprofit boards they have given generously of time, leadership and treasure to numerous nonprofits in our community of Novato and beyond.

As the District Governor of D5150, I was honored to present Dr. John with the highest honor of him receiving one only six of Rotary Foundation's 2009's "SERVICE AWARD FOR A POLIO-FREE WORLD.. Millions of the world's children are polio free because of his tremendous efforts.

With the help of Rotarians from around the world and the matching grants from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, we are "This Close" to the eradication of this dreaded disease.

To my Doctor, my mentor and friend, Rest in Peace with your Lord for a job well done!




