The Speaker

Dr. Moses Jacob introduced our speaker **Ed Ryken**. Some recognized him in his role (retired) as CEO of Whistlestop. In his retirement **Ed** became the Coordinator of Waterbird Docents on the island of Alcatraz.

Ed discussed the Native American period where the various tribes gathered eggs and then the Spanish, Mexican, United States and importantly the US Military's cycle on the island The island is 21 acres and the equivalent of 13 stories tall.

The theme was the adaptability of the various species. Blue herons like the eucalyptus trees. The snowy egrets like the overgrown north side of the island. Cormorants like the west side.

One species comes to Alcatraz because they nest in the holes left by pulling off the wood frame from concrete. Some of the birds come from British Colombia.

Ed also discussed breeding and nest behavior. There was a discussion of the female showing the male how to do it... but this is a family bulletin.

Kudos to the speaker committee for an entertaining and enlightening talk.



EYEGLASSES FOR OTHERS:

Thanks to Russ Ketron, the Rotary Club of Novato has supported eyeglass reuse projects for many years. This includes the boxes of eyeglasses that **Russ** pays to ship to the USC Ophthalmology Department for grading and disbursement in their free eye clinic in Los Angeles.

In addition, we support the Global Re-Vision International Project with a small donation. The \$500 we send helps pay for the necessary software to help make the grading and distribution of free eye glasses work.

Global Re-Vision is working with three states in Mexico in the distribution of glasses to the poorest of the poor. Rotarian Bob Martin, Executive Director, says that they have exceeded one million pairs of glasses that have now been collected and made available for distribution.
