We got a sneak peak of **Ryan Lee's** drone's introduction to the redo of our Club's website. Once again, those of us of a certain age were wowed by the technology of this new member.

Who'z Dat Rotarian?

- 2) **Ed Ross** was given the following clue: While swimming in the Cayman Islands, this Rotarian ran into a school of sharks; **Ed's** guess of **Suzanne Bales** saw him spinning the Wheel of MisFortune which directed him to wear something red to the next meeting!
- 3) The third and final clue was directed at **Al Angulo**: this Rotarian was born in Omaha, NE. Al earned a trip to the Wheel of MisFortune, with the guess of **Dennis Hagerty**, a much-beloved former member. His spin cost him \$20.

This week's mystery Rotarian was Penny Hansen.

COM Partnership

President Tom announced that COM has agreed to help us promote the Novato Speakers Series and a COM staff member has agreed to join our club.

Program

Our speaker, **Marilyn Nemzer**, was introduced by **Moses Jacob**, as a 32-year Rotarian, who also served six terms on the Marin County Board of Education.

Marilyn lives in Tiburon with husband Ken, two sons and two dogs. The overarching theme of her life has been education – her own and for children. She ran the Global Book Exchange at Hamilton and San Rafael from 2000 until 2022 and shipped more than 100K books to 45 countries! Today she told us about the two-year odyssey of a shipment of books to Uganda.

She started us off by explaining that literacy is a great equalizer for children. At what is now known as The Book Exchange of Marin, about 2K students from the County are invited to their warehouse and encouraged to select 19 books apiece to take home. Teachers are also encouraged to take back books to their classrooms. She singled out our **Al Angulo** as being a huge help for the last 25 years.

The two-year shipping project started in February of 2022. The Exchange had put together a 40-foot container filled with books, destined for children in Africa. They raised the money to ship the books which took almost a year. It was off and arrived in Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania where they first had to prove that all the content of the books were safe for the children. Then the officials demanded that they make a list of every single book title. After 10 months, they were still waiting for government approval to deliver the books to the schools in need. Finally, after endless WhatsApp messages, the government would not allow the books in the country.

Rather than shipping the books back to the U.S. which would be counterproductive, to say nothing of the cost of shipping, with the help of Rotarians in Uganda and Tanzania, it was determined that the 40K books could be trucked over land to Uganda.

The truck broke down about 10 miles from the Ugandan border and they had to wait four days for repairs. With the serendipitous Rotarian gods watching over them, San Rafael Rotarian **Melissa Prandi's** project in Uganda was able to help the books get delivered and distributed to very happy children and schools!


