Recognition

The Speaker

Dennis Hagerty introduced our speaker (he did this while he is in Colorado enjoying time with his family.)

Vanessa Bloom currently works at Marin Gastroenterology, and was raised in a musical family. Her father and both brothers are professional musicians. Vanessa's father has performed for our Club before. Vanessa started playing piano at age 2 and decided to switch to violin at age 8.

Vanessa first wished that everyone is happy and healthy. She then went on to introduce the violin which was invented in the early 16th century at Italy. She also introduced the mechanism of the violin (do you know the 2 holes on the surface are called "f" holes because its shape?). Originally there were only 3 strings and the bow was made from horse hair (now they use a synthetic material). The base of the bow has a funny name called the "frog" (not sure where it came from).

What's the difference between a fiddle and violin? Physically there is no difference, but it depends on the way you play the it. A violin has a shoulder rest so you can play high notes easier, but not with so with the fiddle. **Vanessa** went on to play some "Irish fiddle music" and several more lovely songs that made me want to get up and dance.

She then play a song called "Celtic Air" that was composed by her friend to memorialize the Irish Revolution.

Argentinian Tango is also one of **Vanessa's** favorite types of music. She then played a music called "Buy a Hat" - a song about a man that lost everything.

The program ended with **Vanessa** playing a finale piece "Sur le Fil" which touched everyone. "Sur le Fil" is from the motion picture "Amelie" by **Yann Tiersen**. It actually means "On the wire or at the edge of the knife"... Thanks for the input **Rene** gave to me in the chat room.

Our Club's greatest musician, **Jay Wayne** shared his thoughts with **Vanessa** and enjoyed her music very much.

Al Dunham mentioned that his granddaughter also plays violin and he enjoys **Vanessa's** music too.

Larry Mazzotta asked about the key of the violin. **Vanessa** explained violin can be tuned to different keys depends on the music. Also you can play single string, double or triple.

Russ Ketron asked about the price of a violin. **Vanessa** explained for normal violin, it can range from \$50, \$3,000 to \$10,000. For a famous violin, it can cost \$500,000 or even higher. The top brand violin Stradivarius (worth millions) has only 8 left that are still playable and **Vanessa** has played three of them. Also, violins made from different regions sounds different.

Gloria Dunn-Violin asked why violins are so unique and can't be copied? Vanessa thinks making violins are like an art form and it is hard to get it exactly the same.

Everyone appreciated her performance and it was a great program.
