in Marin since 2015, and a trained Climate Reality Leadership Corps speaker since 2017. He is now an elected member of the Corte Madera Town Council, is in fact Vice Mayor this year, and is on the Climate Action Committee and the Climate Adaptation Steering Group in Town. He also co-chairs the Climate Action Committee of the Marin County Council of Mayors and Council Members. So you might say he isn't really retired at all.

David mentioned he that he was trained by "The Climate Reality Project". He is also involved in the Citizens' Climate Lobby (CCL) "organization.

David started his presentation by stating we have underestimated the risk of global warming. Here are a few facts: Four of the hottest months in human records are during June 2019 – September 2020. Most of the heat has been stored in the oceans which leads to loss of most warmwater corals. The ice in Greenland is rapidly melting which will have serious consequence in the long run (simulation shows part of Florida will be under water). Feb 2020 had the highest temp recorded in Antarctica. Arctic permafrost thaw plays a greater role in climate change than previously estimated. CO2 is at its highest level in 800,000 years.

To solve these problem, actions are needed at the national level such as: Drive large-scale change quickly, support free market choice, incentives for countries to act together.

Also there is a movement to support "carbon fee and dividend" which is believed to be the best solution and supported by various group including Citizens' climate lobby (CCL) that **David** belongs to.

CCL is a grassroots volunteer organization creating the political will to address climate with a national carbon fee and dividend. 394 of 435 congressional districts covered (90%) with more than 180,000 supporters. The founder, the late **Marshal Saunders**, was a life-long Rotarian from San Diego. Right now they are proposing a bill in congress (H.R. 763 S.2284 Durbin Bill). It will reduce 40% carbon emissions over the next 12 years.

David also gave us some ideas on what to do as an individual: We can help by driving an EV; Ride a E-bike; Go solar; Invest in Alternative fuel companies; Support city's climate action plan; Change your diet (eat less meat); and Sign up for MCE deep green.

Also here are the Actions for us:

- Endorse the concept of carbon fee and dividend
- Choose a sector of action
- Step up in support of city and county actions
- Promote individual actions

After the presentation, our new member - **Roy Pfeifer** spoke out and mentioned that he is the president of "SustainNovato.org". They have done various projects in Novato to help for environment. The Annual fee is \$25 and welcome all are welcome.

Ron Harness also mentioned that there is a new committee in our Club called "Environmental Sustainability Committee" and he would like to invite Club members to join to do projects which will help the environment.

Craig McCurdy mentioned that there is a project to plant more redwood trees. **David** responded that is a great project to increase carbon absorbing.

The last question went to **Ed Ross** who asked about the impact of carbon related to generating electricity.

In California, most power is generated by natural gas, 20% from nuclear, 20-25% from hydro; with wind and solar taking over nature gas.

It was a very interesting program, with more discussion that followed after the meeting.

President Chris reminded members about the program for next week, and then went on to select the raffle winner. But due to little computer glitch, Chris decided we would have 2 winners for the day. Three people claimed to be the winner - Ron Harness, Moses Jacobs and Robert Marshall. All three guys will have a show down after the meeting to settle the final 2 winners.


District 5150 Zoom PRLS Masters 4, Instruction October 10, 2020


Rotary Zoom Meeting: October 9, 2020
