

ROTARY GLOBAL SCHOLAR

Each year our district sponsors one Global Scholar in the amount of \$31,500 for graduate level academic study in another country. This amount includes an 80% match from the Rotary Foundation.

Our club can nominate people for this scholarship. Their area of study must be in one of Rotary's Areas of Focus: water and sanitation, peace, disease prevention, community development, environment, education and saving mothers and children.



The latest Global Scholar selected is Ian Good.

Ian Good is a lawyer and 2022 graduate of UC Berkeley, School of Law. During his time at law school, Ian studied and worked on a range of human rights issues including child slavery and the death penalty. Currently, after graduating from law school, Ian worked for two years in big law firms. He has received the Rotary Global Grant Scholarship to attend the prestigious Université Paris Pantheon Assas where he will study Public Law and Democracy. The program is a 10-month, seminar-based program taught by renowned French and international professors in the field of democratic practice and political theory. A Bay Area native, Ian enjoys outdoor activities and endurance athletics in his free time.

Later this Rotary year there will be another round of Global Scholar interviews so keep your eyes open for possible candidates.
