In closing, Jeff told us one of the things he took away from this 20-day 500-mile hike was that if you can remove all of the distractions in your life, it's amazing what can be accomplished. Another point, written on a sign Jeff photographed during his journey: "Sometimes you find yourself in the middle of nowhere; and sometimes, in the middle of nowhere, you find yourself." Thank you, Jeff, for a very interesting talk.
