The Speaker

Our speaker, **Larry Bauer**, President of the Marin County Grand Jury Association, was introduced. He spoke to us about the function and importance of the Grand Jury as a "watchdog" for monitoring the activities of governments and government agencies within the County, including the County government, City governments and all special districts within the County. The Grand Jury consists of 19 sitting Jurors

and 11 alternates, and, as a function of the Judiciary, is mentored by a local judge. The Grand Jury is empowered to investigate any issue they deem important; the results are almost always published in a public report. Recent issues have included website transparency of Marin County public agencies, First Responder Programs

for seniors, use of body cameras for police departments, improvements in foster care services and the Marin County \$300,000 "slush" funds. **Mr. Bauer** was joined by Novato Sunrise Rotarian **David Gabriel** who has served on a Grand Jury and spoke of how rewarding and fulfilling the experience was to him. Applications to serve may be obtained from the Grand Jury office (at the Count offices in San Rafael) or via their website. The application deadline for the next Jury panel will be April 22, 2022.
