Do You Know Someone Who Would Be A Good Applicant??

Each year our Rotary District funds one Global Scholar. Our club has been a generous donor to this program which gives an opportunity to get an advanced degree in one of the seven Rotary Areas of Focus:

Applications for the Rotary Global Grant Scholarship from Rotary District 5150 (Rotary clubs located in San Francisco, Marin, and San Mateo counties) are now open until March 23, 2024. The scholarship of USD\$31,500.00 supports one year of tuition and living costs at an international university for graduate study

- This is not a needs-based scholarship and is based solely on the qualifications of the candidate.
- Candidates must be from the United States and must study outside of their home country and in a country where a Rotary Club exists.
- Candidates must be sponsored by a Rotary Club in District 5150, and clubs may sponsor more than one candidate for this scholarship.
- Candidates may not be Rotarians, Honorary Rotarians, or employees of a club, district, or other Rotary entity or of Rotary International. Spouses, lineal descendants (child or grandchild by blood or legal adoption), spouses of lineal descendants, or ancestors (parent or grandparent) of persons in the aforementioned categories are also ineligible. Please note that Rotarians and their relatives remain ineligible for scholarship awards for 36 months after a Rotarian has resigned from club membership.
- Scholarship must be used for a graduate program masters, PhD, or post-doctoral program. This scholarship is not available for undergraduate studies.
- Candidates must have completed their undergraduate degree program before commencing scholarship studies.
- Candidates must either have a full offer or conditional offer to a graduate program at time of application or have one remaining full academic year of a graduate program from a multi-year program. This scholarship is not available for a partial year of study.
- Candidates must have ability to express source of funds for remaining costs above and beyond the USD\$31,500 of this scholarship (See "Additional Funding" on application).
- Candidates may seek or be awardees of other Rotary Scholarships.

Amount of Scholarship and Key Dates

- USD\$31,500 awarded for 2024-25 and may be used for travel, housing, tuition, books, supplies, and/or living expenses.
