He has a bachelor's degree from Williams College and attended Harvard University's Executive Program on National and International Security. Program

Captain Sasha D'Amico introduced Fire Marshall Lynn Osgood who will be presenting on Wildfire Prevention. Lynn Osgood has had a long career since she joined Napa Fire in 1995 and rose through the ranks in Marin County and Novato as Fire Inspector, Deputy Fire Chief, and currently Battalion Chief. The three main Goals are: 1) Bring good fire back to Novato 2) Windfire prevention Projects such as chipper days and fuel reduction

events 3) Utilize New Technology for Prevention. Fire Marshall Osgood presented sobering facts of recent fires like the Dixie Fire, Camp Fire, Maui Fire and most recently the LA Fires since 2017 and the heavy heavy devastation to infrastructure, homes, financial burdens, and fatalities. The way we can prevent fires is through Adaptation that equals Survival and Resiliency. Using a Holistic Approach to reduce Home Ignition such as creating less flammable homes: better roofing, metal gutters vs plastic, reducing fuel loads around the house (e.g. wood for fireplaces away from house, get rid of flammable plants like rosemary and juniper near homes, replace wooden gates with metal gates within 5 feet of home). There was so much great information from Lynn Osgood including available grants for homeowners; create vegetation free zones around home, local resources like Fire Mitigation Rangers. Ed. Note: After the meeting Peter Pelavin, offered this advice, "As an estate planner, we have recently been contacting our clients to remind them that when a person or couple put real property into the name of a trust, they must contact their homeowner insurance company to let them know and have either the trust or the trustees named as additional insureds. We have found out that quite a few of our clients were not aware of this despite specific directions to do this."

Lynn was presented with watercolor notecards painted by PP Alan Duham and she picked two tickets for the raffle.
