Program

Duffy Jennings, who came last year with his book Reporter's Notebook, stories from his days as crime reporter for the SF Chronicle. He and our own Frank **Falzon**, who served on SF Police from 1970 to 1992. crossed paths in the 70s and 80s and they reconnected just 2 years ago. That's when the idea of this book collaboration came about. Duffy had the right stuff, knew punctuation and how to craft a story and Frank had the inside story on many of these cases and they produced the book San Francisco Homicide Inspector 5-Henry-7. 5 Henry 7 refers to Frank's radio call sign and this book covers 13 cases that captured the attention of the public and memorable for Frank, still gives him chills, investigating the dark side of homicide. Frank also stated being in Rotary has helped him see the positive and good side of life.

The talk began on the Night Stalker case at a home near Lake Merced in SF. Peter and Barbara Pan were the victims of Richard Ramirez and Frank shared how for 17 days he worked tirelessly with Glendale PD in southern California to identify who the Night Stalker was. A chilling story when Richard Ramirez, turned during the booking and said to Frank "Hey Falzon how about those two old ladies on Telegraph Hill" referring to a homicide of two sisters that was unsolved up to that point. Frank kept us on the edge of our seats with more stories of the cases, we wish we had more time for his talk. His investigations included the Zebra Murders and Nightmare on Portrero Hill where the victim gave testimony, in the hospital as she laid dying, to Frank of the horrific crime.




