It started when she was School Principal in the small town of Duarte in Southern California. The Superintendent was a Rotarian and invited her to join in 1978, 5 years before women were allowed to officially join. There were many law suits leading to a U.S. Supreme Court decision in 1987 which ended gender discrimination. Her book "Women Also Serve" was on sale after the meeting.
