**Ron** shared photos representing the cultural aspects of Guatemala including ceramics, fabrics, murals, dances, painted buses and several buildings with arches.

**Rob** described the water filtration systems installed this year. In a hospital in Escuintla they brought the system

up to provide 100,000 liters per day. They also installed a 40,000 liter system for Chuiatzan, a community of 1200 homes.

In addition to **Ron** and **Rob**, **Jorg Westerheide** attended from our Club. Members of several Clubs in our District also participated. Another trip is being planned for Rotary Year 2023-24. Our Club has helped fund and participate in this project over the past several years.


