Red to Blue Badges

Past President Ron Harness presented Jeff Slavitz and Marcus Combs with their Blue Badges. Marcus described the Red Badge process as being enjoyable and similar to General Ed classes in college, which allows you to learn about many different things and help find where your interests lie. Jeff said he loved being a red badge member, because everybody thinks you're new and energetic, even if it has been two years! Jeff has also enjoyed the Red Badge process and meeting all the members.

5 Minute Talk

Delyn Kies completed another step towards her Blue Badge by doing her Five Minute talk. Delyn has been retired for about 6 years from a career in garbage and recycling. She worked in Oregon managing recycling programs and landfills as well as getting state wide legislation passed to require recycling throughout the State of Oregon. In 1994 she came to Novato and worked with Harding, Lawson, and Associates in environmental consulting throughout the Western United States, Hawaii and Saipan. She also worked Shea Homes during the redevelopment of Hamilton AFB. In 2001 Delyn got laid off from Harding, Lawson but her husband also had been laid off from his job the week before, so he helped set up a consulting business, so she could finish the environmental projects still in process. She has been active in a lot of different organizations throughout her life. Most recently **Delyn** started fostering dogs for Guide Dogs for the Blind. She loves meeting new people, learning new things and keeping busy. So rotary has been the "perfect fit" for her.!

Program

Tom introduced our speaker **Lauren Vuong**, a native of Vietnam, and a naturalized US citizen. At the age of 8, with her family as post-war refugees, she immigrated to the US. She's a graduate of UC Berkeley and USF and remains a practicing attorney. She wrote an international award winning documentary about her experience as a refugee called "Finding the Virgo".

Lauren tearfully recounted the emotional story of leaving Vietnam at seven years of age in an open boat with her


family and about 60 other refugees. It was a physically and emotionally demanding experience punctuated by seasickness, starvation, dehydration, living in human waste and the fear of imminent death. After 10 days they were rescued by a passing ship (Lauren later learned they were passed by 120 others). Lauren and her family immigrated to the US, where Lauren attend college and eventually became a lawyer. In the process of looking for scholarships she wondered about finding "that ship". In 1991, before the internet, the search was very laborious, but she kept at it. In 2007, in a conversation with her mother she noticed her mom mispronounced the name of a street and realized she had been looking for the wrong ship. Her mother had also been mispronouncing the ship's name. The ship was named the "LNG Virgo". Now with the internet, Google and her best friend in the world, who's an incredible researcher it was easy to locate the Virgo. Finding the crew was a different story. That search took another nine years. But she eventually found the Captains widow and some of the crew. She also learned that the refugees were transferred to a Naval ship. She tracked down that ship's captain who, it turns out had been wondering about what happened to the refugees he had helped rescue. There was a reunion of the remaining crews and Lauren's family so they could say thank you! In closing, Lauren says she has all the benefits of both parents, an education, children, a career thanks to, "The compassion of Americans, the compassion of mariners, just good people".
