computers, providing stable Internet sources, and monitoring progress of programs. As this program has been in place, attendance, pass percentages have all improved with the improvements provided by this project. This project has grown to include three locations: Unguturu School, Vissannapeta Tribal Welfare School, Busarajupalli Tribal Welfare School. The way out of poverty and into the opportunities of today's world is through education. Many young tribal girls are either sold as young brides or into servitude as their impoverished families have little choice. The initial goal was to raise \$90,000 and that has grown to over \$719,00 with a large private donation from Dr. Reddy Labs, a multinational pharmaceutical company based in India, which contributed a large amount for infrastructure such as STEM classrooms, toilets, and dormitories. A 12 minute documentary film was screened showing the upgrades of kitchen, dining halls remodeled to clean and well-lit spaces, monkey mesh installed to prevent the monkeys from causing havoc, computer labs equipped with desks and computers all to provide a safe, healthy, environment to learn and encourage and empower young girls with education, One student highlighted wanted to become a cardiologist, because a young family member died because of heart failure, this student is determined to help her community and provide healthcare for those who cannot afford it. Final quote of the film is "Education Is the greatest equalizer between rich and poor".
