# **Featured Potarian**

**Lynn** is starting a "new" tradition: The Featured Rotarian which will be a five-minute presentation from long-time members (formerly known as Craft Talks) to enable newer members to get to know a bit about them and their careers. The first one was our president, **Lynn**.

She was born in Cheyenne, WY and began her college career at a small liberal arts college, Colorado College with a psychology major. She then transferred to UT Austin where she met now-husband Carl and graduated. Carl had learned to love skiing, so they moved back to Colorado and spent her whole career in executive management and healthcare. She and Carl have one son, Michael, whom many of us met at the Installation/Debunking. He lives with his wife in San Francisco and plays polo (horse, not water) in Petaluma on the weekends. After retiring, Lynn and Carl bought a house in Novato -between SF and Petaluma – and after visiting often moved here permanently in 2020. She visited all the Rotary clubs in town and chose ours to join because it was larger and very welcoming! She has jumped right in and become very involved and thinks she absolutely made the right decision!

# **Program**

President Lynn Dawson, "Looking Forward to the Rotary Year". President Lynn indicated that her new Board of Directors has all been working since April to come up with a Strategic Plan for the year. Initially, she came up with her goals for the year, then each director reviewed those and developed their goals for 2025-26. They also developed a budget for the year to fit the goals.

Chris DeGabriele, our new Treasurer, indicated that the club spent about \$10K more last year than we had taken in, but not to worry, the club has a healthy reserve of about \$50K. His principal goal is to find a new treasurer for next year.

Director for Club Administration **John Reuscher** has already completed his first goal of upgrading the sound system at the Jonas Center which was roundly applauded. He plans to keep everything running smoothly for our meetings and to keep the Bar Committee sober and organized.

Gloria Dunn-Violin, director of Environmental Sustainability, has an ambitious agenda. The committee will give a short presentation on fire safety on the third Friday of each month to the club. They also plan to continue their tree planting and to educate Novato school children about the importance and benefits of trees.

Holly Axtell, World Community chair extraordinaire, announced the committee will have a couple of new small service projects. She announced that the club had just been notified of \$32K in DDF (District Designated Funds) that has been awarded to the club from TRF (The Rotary Foundation). Stay Tuned!

Patty Dougherty and Sonia Seeman are cochairing the Membership committee. They have a goal of 105 members by June 2026. Sonia reported that the dues are due! \$1440 for a sustaining member, eating lunches, \$804 for those choosing to not eat lunch or who wish to pay \$35 occasionally to eat lunch. Sonia also announced a new dues policy for new members. Now for the first year, a new member pays only \$804 and receives lunches essentially free. This is a change from two years of free lunches. There is also a Young Professionals membership for those 35 and younger that is \$480/year.

Jim Spilman spoke up in his dulcet tones and reminded us that the connections that we make through all our Rotary activities – scholarships, Teacher Recognition, community projects, etc. - are good for the club as well as for the recipients. Feed the connections!

# **Lynn's Closing Comments**

President Lynn announced the August social will be an All-Novato Clubs function at Christina Stroeh's home featuring the wonderful voice of Shauna McNulty of Beach Blanket Babylon fame. It will be on Friday evening, August 22. More details to follow. Before adjourning the meeting, which was promptly at 1:30 pm, she also thanked today's greeters Nohemi Beisseman-Mason and Christina Stroeh.
