The Speaker

Maggie Shao introduced our presenter, Jack Gedney, co-owner of Wild Birds Unlimited, a birdfeeding and nature shop located at Vintage Oaks Shopping Center. He writes *On the Wing*, the Marin IJ's biweekly column on local birds. Jack is the author of a compact field guide to Bay Area trees and his new book, *The Private Lives of Public Birds: Learning to Listen to the Birds Where We Live*.

Jack, showed his great knowledge and expertise throughout his very informative and engaging presentation on 15 local birds, although we are often fascinated by rare birds, he wanted to have us learn some interesting facts about common birds and to better appreciate them. Helping us understand, he categorized the birds into categories. A question to Jack was of the birds

he presented on, which bird would he be? The Califronia Towhee, also known as the Brown Chippee, because of the squeaky chip sound or call they make, a dark brown backyard bird in the Sparrow family that is one of the few monogamous birds who pair with mates for life. Another bird was the Anna's hummingbird, with the males brilliant magenta almost metallic throat feathers have long beaks as well as a long tongue to feed on nectar. He recommended to get a wide flat feeder with 4 parts water to 1 part sugar syrup, they also like grape jelly. Scrub jay or Blue Squaker are incredibly intelligent in that they have spatial memory and one bird can store 6,000 acorns and will be able to retrieve 3,000 of those acorns from memory. They help spread oaks to germinate by the acorns left behind. His presentation had great photos of birds and easy ways to identify them, and also shared audio of some bird calls like that of the Mourning Dove. He also shared with us the Northern Mockingbird that spreads its wings during courtship and they are likely the ones you hear 4am in the morning singing. Mockingbirds can mimic up to 300 sounds, an impressive mimic. Lots of questions from the audience after the talk including a comment from Phil **Dougherty** about using fake black dead birds as a deterrent for other birds, and it worked well, and Jack confirmed that at his shop, they have sold over 500 fake dead black birds, a non-toxic and sustainable way of deterring blackbirds/crows. A great presentation and also local resource for anything bird related to go to his shop, Wild Birds Unlimited.
