The Speaker

Maggie introduced our speaker, Norm Gershenz who is the CEO and co-founder of SaveNature.org and Director of the Insect Discovery Lab. The Organization's mission is both education and conservation, preserving thousands of acres of rain forest, coral reefs, and desert habitat around the world. He created and developed the first Adopt-An-Acre program in the US. Norm was affiliated for 18 years with the San Francisco Zoo. He has handled boas and bobcats, elephants and pandas, snow leopards and koalas. Realizing that endangered animal species are only a signal of endangered habitats and ecosystems. SaveNature.org has received the World Wildlife' Fund's Conservation and The Nature Conservancy's Outstanding Contribution to Conservancy Awards. Norm is also a

gourmet insect chef, expert birder, and can spot a beetle while driving down the road at 50mph.

The presentation started with a short PowerPoint presentation highlighting the medicines and incredible diversity and beauty on this planet earth, and educating our children through Youth Exploring Nature and the Insect Discovery Lab which engages and educates our youth in the wonders of nature. The Insect Discovery Lab annually holds 800 programs and reaches 38,000 students in the Bay Area. Youth Exploring Nature is a newer program to address Environmental Literacy, Education Equity, and Hands On reaching out to underserved students.

Norm demonstrated the impact of hands-on learning by introducing living arthropods including a lubber grasshopper that displays warning colors in orange and red to potential predators that indicate that they don't taste good and perhaps are toxic if you eat them.

Jordan Manchester, Education Specialist and Maggie Shao assisted by presenting some of the amazing arthropods to the tables so folks could pet or hold a grasshopper, millipede, or hissing cockroach. Norm then brought out a Malaysian phasmid (stick insect) that measured a good 6 to 8 inches long with the most curious face, one that inspired George Lucas as a model for aliens in his films. This insect has a couple of ingenious ways of avoiding predation, one is being still and looking like a leaf or twig, another behavior of curling up its abdomen and looking like a scorpion. We were taken to the continent of Africa, where the giant African millipede (also 6 to 8 inches long) is found. This vegetarian insect that eats and scavenges along the ground and soil curls up into a ball when threatened, and you can't make heads or tails of where the millipede starts. The feel of the many legs, 4 legs per segment, and with 50 or more segments, the audience experienced the feeling of 200 plus tiny legs undulating across your palms. Katie Chase was brave and showed her sons Owen and Parker how to pet or hold some of these amazing creatures. The island of Madagascar, maybe better known for the animated movie, is home to our last visitor, the hissing cockroach. The cockroach 'hisses' when threatened by pushing air through the spiracles (breathing tubes along the side of the body) which sounds like a snake and can warn predators to back off. Folks in the audience provided lots of ohhs and ahhs and folks pulling out their phones snapping headshots of our arthropod guests today.

This program demonstrated today is available for birthday parties, classroom visits and through the Youth Exploring Nature program, SaveNature.org hopes to come back to Novato and visit some of the elementary schools. Also, you can Adopt-An-Acre to help preserve and conserve our disappearing natural ecosystems. Check out their website at SaveNature.org.


