Continuing **Past President Phil's** "Service Above Self" award presentations, **President Tom** called on **Mike Morrissey**, the first SASY recipient this Rotary year. **Mike** has been very active behind the scenes. He has helped on multiple service projects, produced all the **Marty's** Moments segments, has served on the Club Board and funded Scholarships, just to name a few things. **President Tom** asked about **Mike's** pre-retirement life. **Mike**

described his work life as "his evolving". The short version of **Mike's** resume is that he started as a Cal Poly graduate, working as a Landscape Architect. Then travel and work blended. He was a bus driver in Istanbul and Katmandu. spent 20 years in Asia, worked at the Environmental Institute in Tokyo, later started his own company in Bangkok, which he sold to a multi-national company and that is when **Mike** retired. Phil Dougherty Past President Due to the many inquiries about the recent showing of the slide show from his trip to the RI Convention in Singapore, **President Tom** treated us to a second showing.

Getting to know you...

In the spirit of getting to know each other better, **President** Tom called on Larry Harrison to talk about some of his life experience. Larry lived in St. Louis and graduated from high school in 1970. While still in high school a people from Israel came to request help harvesting crops in Israel. At this time, most of the Israeli population was still in active service as a result of the military conflicts. Being Jewish and seeing an opportunity to give back, Larry and a schoolmate volunteered. They went to Israel and lived on a Kibbutz for several months. Starting at 3am they harvested fish, pulled weeds and picked fruit. He met many people from all over the world, which caused him to see his homeland in a different light and opened his mind to new ideas. The harvesting was aggravating his athletic injuries and then in one day he received a letter from his girlfriend, saying she was marrying a Marine and one each from his mother and father saying they were divorcing. So Larry headed back to St. Louis and a couple of weeks later, the enlightened Larry needed to get out of St. Louis and moved to the Bay Area near his brother. This led him to meet his wife **Chris**. **Larry** noted how his life choices put him on the path to where he is today. He reminded us to do the same for ourselves and make adjustments if needed to get where we want to go.

Our Speaker

District Governor, **Stacy Vance**. **Stacy** started in Rotary as a Rotaractor in 2010. **Stacy** is a member of the new San Rafael Marin Evening Club and has been a Rotarian for 15 years. **Stacy** has been involved in Rotary at many levels of leadership from Club to District and is a Master PRLSs graduate. She is also involved in non-profits outside Rotary. **Stacy** introduced **DG Steve Wright**. **Steve** has been a member of the Pacifica Rotary Club since 1987 and is a two time president and held most every other position in the Club. At the District Level he has also held many leadership positions. **Steve** was selected as District 5150 Rotarian of the year in 2018. **Steve** and his wife **Colleen** (a Rotarian since 1994) have hosted three Rotary Youth Exchange students and both have extensively support Rotary financially and

have received the 5150 Grand Slam Honor. **Steve** retired in 2019 from the Collections Industry and served on numerous local Boards. **Steve** is an U.S. Army Veteran and awarded the Commendation Medal.

DG Steve presented President Tom with a one-time award because our Club has provided so many (10) members to serve in District level positions this year. Steve moved into his presentation by stating that he was going to keep District Events to a minimum, to let Clubs focus on Club events, where the most important things happen. Steve noted the three reasons for District events: they are fun, provide networking and raise funds for the District Designated Funds. Global Rotary membership is a concern. Numbers are down except in Ukraine, India and Asia. There will be a Membership Summit event on September 7, 2024, which was originally proposed by **PDG Laine Hendricks**. The District Foundation event this year will be on the USS Hornet on October 12, 2024 from 11am to 5pm. Steve noted that with the proximity to the Fleet Week events across the bay, a Blue Angels sighting was possible. Steve noted that RCN has 100% participation in Every Rotarian Every Year, and we should be proud of that!

DG Steve talked about the Rotary themes for the year. The International slogan "The Magic of Rotary" resulted from a Dominican Republic water project demonstration where a child came to incoming RI President Stephanie Hertek and asked her to "Show me more of that magic". The District theme "Hope in Action" was borrowed by Steve from the 1953-54 International theme. The district logo with three hands represents "collaboration" of people, other Rotary Clubs and other organizations; the gloves are for "Hands on Projects" which is the heart and soul of Rotary (Steve even gifted Club Presidents a pair of leather gloves this year); The hands touching represents friendship. Steve talked about the importance of friends and interactions at the club level. Meetings and service projects are where your friends are and where words, hugs and support are given. Steve said thought he discovered this, but it is not a new idea, the first object of Rotary from 110 years ago is "Development of Acquaintances as an Opportunity for Service".

DG Steve said that Rotarians are the helpers when there is trouble in the world. He recalled attending an RI Convention where numerous World Leaders spoke and referred to the 18,000 Rotarians in attendance as fellow World Leaders. Steve then realized that Rotarians are also World Leaders! 49 of the 51 founding members of the U.N. in 1945 were Rotarians and

to this day Rotary is the largest NGO at the UN. No other organization could set out to eliminate Polio worldwide (currently 23there are new cases). Rotarians are helpers locally, leaders internationally. It all starts with one person's idea and the drive, passion, love and money of Rotarians as a group. The world needs Rotary now more than ever. DG Steve related a few stories of how seeming small projects can have a major impact. Things as simple as reading to a child, providing plastic surgery through Rotoplast or saving lives by providing clean water systems.

In closing, **DG** Steve left us with a challenge to "fill in your dash" (picture the dash between your birth and death dates on a headstone). Look at the existing projects are they the best they can be? What about new projects? Put your "Hopes in Action" and share the "Magic of Rotary" with the rest of the world. **Steve** then thanked us for the incredible honor to be our DG, for being his friends and fellow Rotarians. **DG Steve**, Thank for your inspiration!

President Tom thanked us all for coming. Upcoming event reminders: Aug 30 Picnic at Miwok Park led by John Cutrufelli. In the spirit of "The Magic of Rotary" we will have Magician Jay Alexander as our program next week. This is a great opportunity to bring potential members.
