Program

Lynn Dawson went on the stage to introduce our speaker. Lynn first emphasized the importance of youth certification for Rotarians so we can conduct any youth program. Also, due to COVID, we have not done our Job Shadowing Project for a long time; instead, there is a similar project called "Magnolia Project" and our speaker today is Gianna Biaggi.

Gianna founded Magnolia Project through a High Tech High - New School Creation Fellowship in 2021. She is a social entrepreneur, former teacher and administrator.

She has a B.A. from Kenyon College, an M.Ed. from the High Tech High Graduate School of Education, and a Career Technical Education credential in Education, Child Development and Family Services.

Gianna mentioned there are 30% of students absent since COVID in Sonoma County and around 16% in Marin county. Magnolia Project provides mentoring to students in need. They use the model 1. Pre-work still building 2. Off campus experience mentor (intern/externship) 3. Pathway such as externship with 3-5 days job shadow or internship with 1-3 weeks work experience.

This program serves 215 students from five districts and three counties. Includes 17 industries and more than 180 businesses partners. Magnolia program is going to host three events for 55 12th grade students in Oct. and Nov. this year.

Gianna invites Rotarians to help to spread the word. Their annual budget is \$50k and 15k are from Novato Unified District. So, donations are welcomed.

They are looking for mentors and more business partners!

Michael Blodgett grew up in Los Angeles and after graduating High School, enlisted in the Army as an Intelligence Analyst. He served with the 9th Infantry Division and Special Operations Command. He received his BA in Political Science from UCLA and went to graduate school at UCSB where he received his Ph.D. in History. He taught history at CSUCI until 2020, when he accepted his current job with the Air Force as an historian for the 349th Air Mobility Wing at Travis Air Force Base.

Introduced to Communism early—his grandfather, interestingly enough, was a Communist. He studied Communism and American diplomatic and military history with a focus on the Cold War and taught these subjects at CSUCI. He has a keen interest in global radicalism and terrorism, and had developed classes on these subjects for CSUCI. In addition to his work with the Air Force, he independently lectures on subjects including American international relations

Elayne Miller organized the City Hall Patio personalized Brick Project in 2008 during the major renovation of City Hall and adjoining administrative complex.
