Program

Rick Grossman started a non-profit called Intelligent Justice. His motivation after decades in the courts litigating for many clients, evolved into his dissatisfaction with the court system. The system was not an economically viable system for resolving disputes. The current system is much more biased to lawyers profiting while clients not so much, thereby not really getting true justice for clients. This system is an adversarial system giving incentives to lawyers duplicating procedures and taking anywhere from 3 to 5 years to resolve. Intelligent Justice looks to resolve disputes through comprehensive adjudication, in half the time and at half the cost. Comprehensive Adjudication utilizes recognized legal experts, pre approved by all parties to thoroughly identify and analyze all relevant law and evidence - and swiftly provide a legally enforceable decision resolving the dispute.
