### Speaker

Moses Jacob introduced our speaker, Krishna Raichura, founder of Pickleball Organized. Krishna gave a brief biography of her family originally from East Africa and Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania and then the family moved to the East Coast of the US where she went to school in Maryland studying GIS/IT. 20 years ago she moved to SF Bay Area for a tech career, spending her first 10 years in SF, then the last 10 years in Novato. Krishna was a tennis player and things pivoted during COVID and people started playing pickleball and she saw a need for organizing this new sport and founded her organization. History of Pickleball started in 1965 in Bainbridge Island, Washington State with a modified badminton net and ping pong paddles and wiffle ball. Interesting fact is that Novato Hill St. Park and Rec are the only free public Pickleball courts (6) in Marin. Other courts are at private clubs and popularity is growing as it's an easy entry sport. Current stats are 4.8 million play in the US. Basics of Pickleball, Court is 44' x 20', underhand serve, and 11 points to win. The mission of Pickleball Organized is to make pickleball accessible and organized for everyone.
