# Speaker Presentation on "Honduras Teacher Empowerment Program/Team for Change", By Maxine Gluckman, Rotary E-Club

Our speaker today is Maxine Gluckman from the E Club. She is going to share about her project "Honduras Teacher Empowerment Program" "Train for Change". Maxine visited our club a couple of months ago and is here today to update us on her program. La Mesa Sunrise was one of the supporting clubs in helping the E Club get started.

She showed a video of the Train for change program is offering professional development for the teachers of Honduras. The programs goal is to improve the quality of education for 1 million children by sharing knowledge, ideas and strategies. They use the "Train the Trainer model" where the teachers go back to their schools and share what they have learned with other staff members.

So far their program has impacted 24 schools, 160 teachers and 4000 students. Maxine has had a connection to Honduras for the past 6 years. There are a lot of challenges in Honduras. A lot of people from the San Diego area have helped develop this program. The goal is to grow to 1000 schools. Support to the teachers is as important as providing a building for them to learn in.

Maxine is working with Rotary to get a Global Grant to continue this work developing teacher training. Manuela shared with us that she grew up in this type of situation and emphasized how important it is to be motivated.
