## Speaker Presentation on "Guatemala HighSchool Entrepreneurship Program ECOMODIDAD", By Maureen Duncan, Rotary e-Club



Our first speaker, Maureen Duncan, gave an update on her project in Guatemala. High School Students are making cloth reusable menstrual pads to help keep girls in school. This is a one -year District project which was started last summer and LMSR was instrumental in providing the funding to start the project. The project seems very successful: two sewing machines have been purchased and local women are doing the sewing. For additional funds the students are making soap with Volcanic Ash that they collect from the local Volcano. The students take pride in creating Ecofriendly items. The plan is to sell the soap and other handcrafted items to tourists in Antigua. Maureen talked about how this project encourages students to finish high school and go on to college, as they come from poor families with no more than a 3<sup>rd</sup> grade education. Maureen presented Jeff,

Christine, John and Manuela a gift of the soap to thank them for their generous support.

# Our next speaker on "Quench and Connect Project": by Dr. Katherine Ely, Founder of the "Quench and Connect"

This San Diego based organization operates in Uganda to provide clean drinking water to High School students by drilling borehole water wells on the school site. Before the Quench and Connect program started 10 years ago, students were getting their drinking water from polluted sources and therefore were always fighting illnesses. Once the students have improved health from drinking clean water, the organization helps by providing textbooks, hands-on Science materials, and University Scholarships.

The wells cost \$8000 each and so far, the organization has installed wells at 30 schools. However, there are 70 more schools on the waiting list.
