

Special Presentation- Peacemaker of the Year: Mark Wheeler and Alix Hart,



Mark thanked us. His grandfather had been a Rotarian so he had been introduced before. When they were asked to take over CAV, they accepted and thought to join Rotary to help make it work.

Mark talked about Alix: Alix has been recognized for her artistic sculptural jewelry, one of probably the top 5 sculptural jewelry

Betty & Clara came up to recognize and present our Peacemaker of the Year presentation awarded to Mark Wheeler & Alix Hart, for their various work including Compassion for African Villages, (CAV) which is a Non-Profit doing: community health services, education services, delivery of education books, and more.



artists in America. Even her early work was on the cover of a Jewelry magazine. Alix works only with recycled fine metals, working so that the pieces are constructed ethically, with many magazine articles and such about her. Alix doesn't want to be a college professor in a system, but does teach many different youth and other metalsmiths. Mark included some of the projects with African artisans and African "PACT", an international nonprofit to impact mining processes. Alix is currently the president of "Ethical Metalsmiths". As an activist, she participated in Women's March, out on the street. And, her other interest, helping animals. She is shown

on a horse, and with her large dog. Mark said she may love animals more than humans.



Alix then talked about Mark. His entire being, study, and career is Philosophy - the love of truth and justice. "Is it the truth", really then fits him. He doesn't take pictures of himself, and doesn't collect pictures of himself, so Alix didn't have as many photos to put into a slideshow for us.

As early as participating in a protest march in NYC when in high school to protest nuclear armament. Teaches at SDSU. As faculty at SDSU, Mark is on Executive committee and Senate, shared governance, redefine quantitative reasoning. Legislative advocacy for public education. Many trips to Sacramento to lobby for the CA colleges and schools, especially when Schwarzenegger was governor. Mark is

involved in the SDSU student grievance process, which is a rare system among colleges to try and get students to have some level of equivalency when there is a grievance. He was voted most influential man on campus after his being in charge of the one year of Darwin celebration. He is also involved in: October 2018, bringing to campus Daniel Ellsberg, activist, former US Military, released the Pentagon Papers in 1971, had previously brought to campus for interview: Chelsey Manning, Activist, former US army soldier, whistleblower. Mark was interviewed on TV when Dali Lama came to San Diego, Amnesty international, led educational tours all over the world, fighting human trafficking. Kung Fu & Tia Chi instructor, started with martial arts in 1985, and of course, donating a kidney.

CAV has been their joint effort and thanks Rotary for assisting in their projects. 2nd shipment of books has been delivered to Africa and is being distributed.
