Guest Speaker: Brittany Kirk, SunlightRetreats.org



Brittany Kirk, a past President of the USD rotary club, and former member of the La Jolla Rotary Club met her husband through Rotary. She works part time at USD and has a two year old son. Brittany had worked for the Armed Services YMCA. Dave and Cheryl Lemox met Brittany when they volunteered with the YMCA Wounded Warrior Projects.

In 2012, Brittany had just been promoted to National Services at the YMCA. Then, while overseas on vacation, Brittany was raped. The trauma completely wrecked her. She had PTSD, gained 60 pounds, and would only talk to her boyfriend. After being attacked she had to take Plan B and go through six months of being tested for STD's.

Through a website she learned that her symptoms were "normal" for rape survivors. One is five women is raped in her lifetime and one in 71 men. Currently in San Diego, there is a rape kit backlog, 2,800 kits that still need testing. After the invasiveness of the rape kit, to not have it processed seems Horrible. There is federal funding available.



Brittany found that there were lots of rape victim's hotlines, but not many places to go for healing, recovery and support. She wanted a safe place to heal, but found nothing that seemed workable.

She attended a YMCA women's retreat that, even though it had nothing to do with sexual assault survivors, was a big help and the start of her recovery. She got Magnus, who she trained to be a therapy dog. She was eventually able to get past the trauma and created a website for survivors.

Brittany wanted to help others learn how to grow beyond trauma and heal, so she started Sunlight Rape Retreats. Along with Shiva Ghaed, a clinical psychologist and trauma specialist, they held a retreat for fifteen survivors.

They had GREAT feedback on the helpfulness of the event. They had many volunteers. – Clinical volunteers, acupuncturists, Love on a Leash, etc. (many from her past experiences at Armed Services YMCA). There is a second retreat planned for August 24 - 26, 2018. It takes about thirty people to run the event. The cost of \$250 per survivor covers food, lodging, liability, and insurance. She has twenty one reservations so far, and can accommodate up to thirty five at this new location. The retreat is for ages eighteen and up. Checks are accepted, and should be made out to Sunlight Retreats

EMDR was asked about, which is a form of therapy for PTSD. taps or buzzes, where you recall the event and the therapist "brings you back", by the tapping or buzzing. Brittany said that the short weekend does not work for long term treatment methods, but those methods are discussed.
