# Speaker: Dani Womack, President for La Mesa Club, Paster of Crosspoint church and Executive Director of 'La Mesa City Hope'

Elena introduced our speaker, Dani Womack and she introduced her responder, and super volunteer, John



Rooks, as the heartbeat of 'City Hope.' He is the dispatcher, has a therapy dog for crisis situations. City Hope responds with any kind of aid they can give to any kind of crisis situations. Most usually they help the under-served. They are called on by the Police, First Responders, Schools, churches and other agencies and they help in all kinds of crisis situations like domestic violence, human trafficking, homelessness and so on.

One project is with the La Mesa/Spring Valley School District. This district has over 600 students that meet the definition of homeless; need assistance during school breaks such as food assistance and activity ideas. For \$15.00 per bag people in the community can donate bags of food to La Mesa Arts Academy for students in need. Things that go in the bags are: cereal, Oatmeal, Complete Pancake Mix, Peanut Butter, Crackers, Rice, Beans (canned) Chili,

Pasta, Spaghetti Sauce (in a can, no glass) Mac & Cheese, Hearty Soups, Granola Bars, Beans and Franks, Snack mixes, and Box Dinners. La Mesa Noon club is instrumental in providing most of these bags for Thanksgiving. Our club has decided to chime in to provide the same service during the Christmas Season.

City Hope coordinates various organizations to assist members of the community in a variety of ways. They have a "haven" which serves as a safe place people can stay until more permanent facilities are identified. They work on reuniting families even, in a few cases, to the point of purchasing airline tickets, making deposits on rentals, rental assistance to avoid eviction. They have a Housing Stability Collaborative which requires the recipients to agree to financial coaching, budget adherence and learning how to reduce expenses and sometimes repay with community service. They are also coached in how to use personal skills to increase their monthly income. One lady who is very good at braiding hair is being coached on how to navigate the requirements for putting that skill to use as a money-maker. The Response Team makes these kinds of calls: 1. Loss of a loved one; 2. Suicide; 3. Fire; 4. Burglars; 5. Robbery; 6. Car Accident; 7. Loss of a student; 8. Domestic Violence; 9. Human Trafficking; 10. Stolen Identity; 11. Sexual Assault; 12. Any trauma or tragedy. How do they know where to go? They get calls from Police/Sheriff (law), churches, Schools, Other organizations. They also spread fliers at various events and places telling of their services.
