MEETING OF JULY 10, 2017

Welcome: President David Harrison (left) kicked off his first meeting with his banjo in hand and in song, describing the RI Theme of "Making a Difference," and adding the RI (Atlanta) Convention flag to the flag board. Changing up the song choices, **President David** and "**Sunshine**" **Mott** led the singing of "**You Are My Sunshine**" with the first verse as a tribute to **Past President Dawn Van Siclen** for her sunshine spirit all through 2016-2017.



Gina McBride provided the Words for the day—describing her personal story of interpersonal connectedness over time—an opportunity for all Rotarians. **Julie Walker** led the pledge. The power point slide provided the words to "**This Land Is Your Land**" with **President David's** banjo accompaniment. **Yvonne Finocchiaro** provided a brief discussion of the manner to make proper Rotary introductions, and two short videos focused on the RI Theme for the Year: Making a Difference.

International Water Projects: President David and **Harry Peacock** (International Service Director) have done considerable prep work to support a clean water project in Vietnam (which does NOT have a Rotary club—usually an absolute RI rule for global grant awards). **President David** contacted the District Governor in District 6600, the Rotary Foundation identified a Host Club in Singapore, and a partnership was developed. The catalyst for this project is Mr. Do Nguyen, PDG 6600, the



enabling club is the Rotary Club of Singapore. CHNR provided support. **Beth Garrow** assisted with the RI process, and the project was approved by RI on June 30. This project will be funded by \$6000 in club funds and The Rotary Foundation funds. This is the very first Rotary Foundation Global Grant in Vietnam, ever! (**Harry Peacock**, left)

This club provided clean water projects on FOUR continents, and those projects were described as: (1) Ivory Coast, Africa; (2) Tanzania, which didn't work; (3) Belize, where EVERY elementary school and orphanage in the country was provided clean water; (4) with Ft. Collins Rotary, this club provided three villages in Honduras with clean water; and (5) partnering with Pt. Loma Rotary, clean water was provided to many villages in Fiji. Working with the techniques used in Fiji, this year the club will provide **nine clean water systems** to the housing built in Tijuana by the club. Club funds for these projects come from the club's fundraising projects while RI funds come from the Paul Harris fellowships and general contributions to RI. Club funds may be matched by Districts AND RI . . .so every contribution dollar multiplies for these worldwide efforts.

Brewfest: Mike Pfankuch identified \$44k in sponsorships thus far for Brewfest and indicated that \$10k in tickets have been sold. **Oceanside Sound** will provide music, and over thirty breweries have been signed up (plus two hard ciders). Help is required to distribute posters and for other event labor. See **Wendy Wiegand** to sign up.

Paul Harris Fellows: Mimi Gaffey reiterated the need for PHF contributions to support the RI worldwide service efforts, and proceeded to "pin" **Beth Garrow** with her PHF + 4 pin and **Dawn Van Siclen** with her PHF + 6 pin. **Gaffey indicated that the club has The Rotary Foundation (TRF) points to share—if you make a contribution to TRF for \$500 she can use club points for the remaining 500 points for a Paul Harris Fellowship in your name.** Contact **Gaffey** for further details.

Walk Across America: President David reported that former CHNR member Kay Ledson is training to Walk Across America and needs support in two areas: (1) to accompany her on a leg to Flagstaff; and (2) someone to connect with Rotary clubs along her route to identify a contact for her.

PROGRAM: JUSTIN GRAHAM CARLSBAD FIRE DEPARTMENT CPR TRAINING

Justin Graham is a paramedic/firefighter with the Carlsbad Fire Department. He teaches CPR and Advanced Cardiac Life Support. He lives in Vista. He brought his AED and his CPR “dummy” to provide “hands-on” experience.



Graham’s rules to assist with cardiac arrest, which is a sudden electrical arrest of the heart:

1. **CALL 911.**
2. Find an AED (which resets the heart rhythm), if possible.
3. Find pulse.
4. Lock fingers over center of chest; hold most of your body weight above the person.
5. Start CPR via chest compressions—110 – 120 beats per minute (fast).
6. Rotate to another compression provider every two minutes, if possible. *(Wendy Wiegand and Robyn Hill practiced, above.)*



How to use the AED:

1. **Call 911.**
2. Open package; turn on.
3. Open shirt of victim.
4. Add patches—one to the top RIGHT of the chest; one to the LOWER left of the chest—on the skin.
5. Let the equipment identify heart rate; plug in patches.
6. It will tell you when to activate.
7. Step back; activate.
8. Return to rapid CPR until help arrives.

How to recognize a stroke, ask:

1. Can you smile?
2. Raise both your arms in front of you.
3. Say: The sun always shines in San Diego.
4. If any of the above are difficult, call 911.

The Trauma Intervention Program provides guidance and help relieve stress to those who PROVIDE assistance in a trauma. The CFD also provides free CPR classes to groups—contact Mary Murphy at the Carlsbad Fire Department.
