## **PROGRAM--OUR OWN--GLORIA FOOTE, KURT** FILIPOVITCH AND REV. LAURA SHERIDAN-CAMPBELL

David Kulchin set the stage for club members as three of our members who brought their thoughts on the end of the calendar year.

Gloria Foote, Financial Planner, kicked off the remarks by saying "we're not looking at where the puck has been, but where it is going." Foote snippets included: we're in the later stages of a bull market; investors are considering more moderate returns; the US economy is more insulated than the rest of the world; markets are volatile; don't let the media be your investment advisor; likely the Fed will increase the interest rate. Internationally, the President-Elect is "putting a lot of smart people around him." "Continue with a rigid spine and steely eyes."

Kurt Filipovitch, CPA, quoted John Adams: "It's our duty to pay our fair share of taxes." From that point, Filipovitch provided an information sheet re The Top Ten Tax-Planning Tips. Some ideas: knock down 2016 income the best you can; bunch itemized deductions to accelerate tax deductions; look at your withholdings to assure accuracy at year-end: consider an IRA rollover into a Roth IRA: increase your charitable giving; and gift tax allows you to give \$14k to anyone.
