### WHO AM I NOW?

Harry Peacock, a native of Virginia, grew up in San Diego, graduated UCLA, studied public service and was a Naval ROTC Midshipman, who, after serving active duty on a destroyer home-ported in Hawaii, returned to So-Cal and began a career in local government management. His first city manager job was in Gardena in 1970. In 1973, he began a twelve and a half year stint as the city manager of Rolling Hills Estates. Along the way, he earned a Master's Degree and a Doctorate in Public Management, both from USC. Peacock joined Rotary in 1986, a year after becoming the City Manager of Saratoga, CA. The polio plus effort was getting underway and Rotary first began to accept women



members. Those two events shaped his Rotary experience, the first sparking interest in the Rotary Foundation and International Service and the second reflected his respect for and support of women professionals. Hi-Noon is his third club. After eleven years in Saratoga Rotary, he joined Malibu Rotary when he became that city's Manager. In 2000, he retired from Malibu and moved to Carlsbad and joined Hi-Noon that fall. In this club, Harry served for several years as Foundation Chair. He has worked on the Mexico house, been Roto-Rooter, Bulletin Editor, participated in Raising Readers, and written grants for international projects. This year, Harry is serving as the International Service Chair. Harry has had the honor of being named Rotarian of the Year and has received the Service above Self award. Harry enjoys playing softball and the clarinet in the Museum of Making Music Concert Band. He loves opera and classical music, traveling the world and other community services activities. He says: "Like many of my long serving Rotarian colleagues, I too have drunk the Koolade and plan to be a Rotarian for life."

#### PROGRAM - DR. BENJAMIN CHURCHILL

Rick Grove introduced Dr. Benjamin Churchill, the Superintendent of Carlsbad Unified School District, who came to Carlsbad from Illinois with a 20 year career in education, to include teaching English in China. He has numerous degrees and is the father to two young girls who attend Carlsbad Unified School.

Dr. Churchill presented a power-point entitled: Did You Know, which was also used at the "State of the District" meeting. CUSD has an operation budget of \$130 million dollars and serves 11.000 students



(6,000 elementary students). Of those 11,000 students, 830 are English Language Learner, 1200 are Special needs, 1 in 5 qualify for low income. CUSD is the fourth largest employer in Carlsbad with 45 percent of the employed living in Carlsbad and 92 employed attended Carlsbad High School. CUSD schools participate in the Great Kindness Challenge in January and this year's event will feature a paddle boat for Kids for Peace.

Award-winning schools use technology to improve the student's readiness for jobs. Two ways CUSD does this is participating the Future Ready Schools and Go Open movements. Using twitter, Facebook and Instagram, the schools are in constant contact with parents and the community. CUSD continues to out-perform county and state indicators and Sage Creek will have its first graduating class this year. CHS is in the top 10 percent of CA schools and top 5 percent in the nation, having earned the Silver award of Distinction.
