A BIT OF LIVING HISTORY AT ALCATRAZ, DICK FISHER

Dick Fisher lived on Alcatraz from 1937-1939 when he was 6-8 years old as his father worked at the prison. He returned to live on the Island from 1956-1958, when he was 25-27 after being in the military, but he said it wasn't quite the same fun experience he had as a child. When he was there

the first time, there was about 30 families that lived on the Island and they had regular scheduled boats (photo left) that took them to San Francisco each day to attend school.

Early Alcatraz History:

1769 Expeditions from San Diego to find locations for four lighthouses on the west coast

1775 Alcatraz is named and used as a Spanish Fort (Isla de Los Alcatraces)

1850 US Army obtains island and uses it as a fort to protect early settlors

1854 First lighthouse on the Pacific Coast

1860 Island used as a temporary military prison

1907 Permanent military prison constructed

1934 Island became a Federal penitentiary

1963 Prison is closed by Robert F. Kennedy due to the significant cost to maintain the prison compared to other locations.

1971 – Was established as a National Park and is designated as National Historic Landmark. In 2014 it was the most visited national park in the country.

 Another fact: from the boat dock to the top of the hill where the cells were located was the equivalent elevation change of seven stories.
