PACIFIC RIDGE SCHOOL **BOB OGLE**

Jeff Segal introduced Bob Ogle, who has been involved with Pacific Ridge School (PRS) in Carlsbad since a year prior to its opening in 2007. Ogle was co-head of the school until 2013, when he became the head of the school. The private school serves students in 7th through 12 grades, with almost 600 students attending this year. He began his talk by asking everyone to think back to 2007 and to consider what

people use in 2017 that was never imagined back then. Items such as Facebook, FitBit, Apple Watch, etc. He said PSR's mission is "to prepare students for college and a purposeful life," and that means preparing them not for what the school thinks the future will hold, but to prepare them to be ready for whatever comes next and to be good members of the community. Ogle said PRS students learn many such skills including the four Cs: communication, collaboration, creativity and critical thinking. In addition to academics, PSR puts a strong emphasis on arts and athletics, club activities, grade-level projects, service learning and global travel. When asked, Ogle said the school's graduation rate and college acceptance rate are each 100 percent.
