# PROGRAM WAGING PEACE - BOGDAN (BOB) MATUSZYNSKI

Joy Prowse introduced our guest speaker who is a border patrol agent and also a Rotary Peace Fellow who works the border at Tijuana. He noted that his goals for his Rotary Peace Fellowship Program are to: 1) have constructive dialogues with other global leaders, 2) have training from actual practitioners and researchers in the field of conflict resolution & peace building, 3) grow global peace networks, 4) create new methods to develop and scale global service projects, and 5) use new training to demonstrate peace building possibilities to Homeland Security personnel.

Matuszynski described some of the larger issues being dealt with at the border such as human trafficking and drug trafficking. In 2017 there were 2,300 homicides in Tijuana compared to 26 in the City of San Diego.

As for bringing Peace to the Border, Matuszynski told us all that if we want to help here are some tips to follow: Get involved with an issue that you may have a background in or ability to assist, such as legal counsel, medicine etc., donate \$\$\$ or goods only to reliable organizations or directly to sources "on the ground" and raise awareness of issues and viable solutions within your personal network.
