respectively: **Joe McDermott, Mike Pfankuch, Velyn Anderson and Neal Stehly**— and was correct!

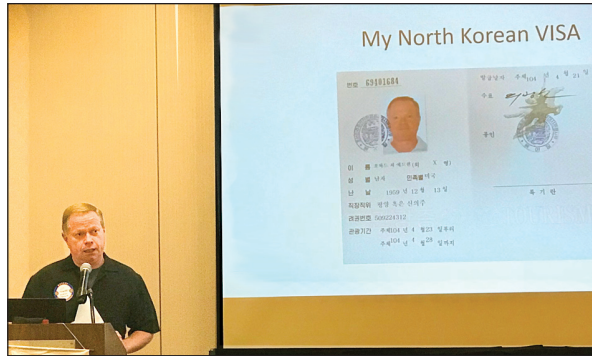

PROGRAM:

A Vacation in North Korea (Really!)

Bob Kreisberg introduced our speaker, Ed Howard, who was part of a tour group that visited North Korea in 2015. He got the travel bug as a child when his family took many trips around the US. Eleven years ago, he realized he had visited all 50 states and decided to expand his horizons. After visiting many countries, he discovered a British tour group that offered guided tours in North Korea.



Howard had stories about how hard it was to get a visa to travel there, about the hotels that harkened back to the 70s in style and decor and about buses that were more reminiscent of the 50s.

He had to be schooled in what he could and couldn't do while in North Korea and had to sign a paper that said he was not a journalist before he could enter. "This is not a country you go to and invent your own rules," he said. Among the things he could not do: no preaching or talk of religion, no unescorted touring, no mention of South Korea, no folding of any photo of NK leaders, etc. Not available in NK: cell phone service, Internet, credit cards, ATMs, travelers checks, no camera memory cards, no American books, movies, TV or music. The positive "no's" included no graffiti, no traffic, no litter, no panhandlers, no stray animals, no homeless seen, no public display of affection. If taking photos of NK leaders' statues, no photos from the back.

His take-away from his visit: It's a country very much stuck in the past and "like a prison where the prisoners are so brainwashed that if the gate was left open, no one would leave."
