**PROGRAM: SURF – Surfers Unite Rotarian Fellowship,
Brett Morey**

Vince Ponce made the introduction of Brett Morey whose family has lived in North County for (now) five generations. Morey is Past President of the La Jolla Golden Triangle Rotary, and '94 graduate of CSU San Marcos, and is the Chairman of the Rotary Rose Parade Float Committee. He is the Founder and CEO of the Surfers Unite Rotary Fellowship, now one year old.



Brett Morey began his presentation identifying the Fellowship opportunities that all Rotarians may enjoy; specific activities related to hobbies and personal interests. There are “now 70 different options, so there’s something for everyone.” This is another way to engage with Rotary and Rotarians by doing good work/service through worldwide groups dedicated to a specific activity (e.g., boating, sports, cultural activities, etc.) He offered a variety of SURF-related events in the recent past or currently on the schedule:

- BRO/AM, Switchfoot at Moonlight Beach, Encinitas had 15,000 people attend and raised \$220,000.
- Life Rolls On at La Jolla Shores will allow 120 adaptive athletes to “get in the water with 650 volunteers.”
- Boys to Men Mentoring/100-Wave Challenge was held on Oct 7 and raised \$40,000 at the event and \$320,000 for Boys to Men.
- Spooky Bonfire will be Oct 27 at Crown Point—an open invitation to Interact students and all students. For more info text BOO to 858.602.2532.
- International Surfing Assoc. World Championships will be at La Jolla Shores Dec 12 – 16 for adaptive surfers.

Membership in SURF is \$20 for a general membership, \$150 for a Lifetime membership and \$500 for a Big Kahuna membership.
