PROGRAM KAY LEDSON - WARRIOR MOMZ WALK

Lisa Rodman introduced the "revolutionary" Aussie and former Carlsbad Hi-Noon Rotarian Kay Ledson.

Kay Ledson painted the picture of her son's spinal cord injury (SCI) in 2006 and the efforts she and other mom of SCI patients do, have done, and will continue to do. Did you know that activity-based therapy is NOT covered by insurance, and that if activity does not continue the injured patient loses physical advancements. The Warrior Momz Walk will start in Carlsbad and walk to New York, stopping to "March on Washington" along the way. Moms of SCI patients throughout the nation will participate along the route, and Rotary Clubs will also be contacted and presentations made. The goal is to raise \$1 million to help finance the awareness needed to raise therapy scholarship funding. The walk, starting on September 22 in Carlsbad will end in New York 28 weeks later—3400 miles, 5500 kilometers, 7 million steps, 22 miles each day.
