PROGRAM MATT TUCKER, NORTH COUNTY TRANSIT DISTRICT

Mark Packard introduced Matt Tucker, indicating that Tucker had an MA in transportation and urban planning, had worked in Phoenix, Santa Clara, and for the State of Virginia. Tucker now lives in Carlsbad and assisted NCTD return to a financially healthy state.

Matt Tucker opened his remarks stating that NCTD is extremely unique in the transportation world as it handles five modes of transportation for North County with an annual budget of \$108 million. NCTD has 165 employees and 700 contract employees and "we don't directly operate any mode of service." NCTD has 1.000 square miles of territory and over 900,000 people to accommodate.

Public transportation strives to provide mobility to everyone. Interestingly, NCTD is working to connect with Uber and Lyft, among others, to supply constituents with the least expense most direct transportation possible via a NCTD "app" ... working with new technologies and partnering options . . . it should be online in April 2018, as NCTD tries to diversify its revenue portfolio.

Regarding rail service, there are now 54 trains a day. Plans include double-tracking the entire San Diego rail system in order to move to 100 trains a day. NCTD and the City of Carlsbad are looking at a below-grade trench for the rail service through the Carlsbad Village.
