PROGRAM - JIM DESMOND

David Kulchin introduced Jim Desmond, Mayor of San Marcos since 2006, a Delta pilot for 30 years and member of the board of the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority. He is a Navy veteran with a degree in Electrical Engineering from San Diego State University. Jim also sits on SANDAG Board, San Diego Regional Economic Development Board, and San Diego Boy Scouts of America Board. He first gave us an updated on Lindbergh Field. In 2007 the county voted against moving the airport to MCAS Miramar and instead developed a plan for improvements. Terminal 3 was completed in 2013, adding 10 new gates, the rental car center was completed last year, they are in process of completing a long term parking garage, and long term plans include redoing Terminal 1. Palomar Airport has been without commercial scheduled service since 2015 when United stopped flights to LAX. A new turboprop carrier Great Lakes Airline is going to start service to LAX, once they get TSA back on site. There is also plans to extend runway by 200 feet, which will more turboprops to fly here, and they have a long range plan of adding 600 feet to the runway. The runway is built on a landfill, so in additional to extending the runway, there will need to be structural work done for larger aircraft to land here.
