MEETING OF OCTOBER 30, 2017

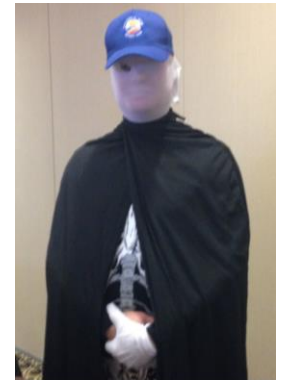

ENCINA WASTEWATER AUTHORITY: FROM WASTEWATER TO IPA

Michael Steinlicht, General Manager of Encina Wastewater, and Scott McClellan, Assistant General Manager and Chief Engineer, together with Stone Brewing Company, presented an interesting program on their joint efforts to improve the sustainability of each organization. Brewing is a water consumptive and waste producing undertaking. Wastewater treatment is an energy consumptive and clean water producing operation. Encina and Stone have joined forces to try and reduce water consumption, air pollution, landfill waste, and non-renewable energy consumption. One demonstration of this collaboration was the production of the first five kegs of "Full Circle Brew" a true "toilet to tap" undertaking. More mundanely, Stone is trucking over 15,000 gallons of waste to Encina each day to produce biogas in Encina's anaerobic digestors in a \$5million investment, \$1million annual operating cost effort to improve the sustainability of their operations. Encina produces 80% of its own electricity from onsite methane production; Stone produces 50% of its electricity from onsite solar production and recycles 50% of its water onsite. It takes 4-5 gallons of water to produce 1 gallon of beer. Stone's solid waste from grains is used as cattle feed.
