PROGRAM CARLSBAD OKTOBERFEST HISTORY SPEAKERS: PHIL URBINA & ED BOERSMA



The program started with a video put together by Mike Metts featuring photos from our Carlsbad Oktoberfest event over the past 34 years. Urbina introduced Ed Boersma, former Carlsbad Hi-Noon Rotarian and the founder of the Carlsbad Oktoberfest. Boersma was a chairman of Oktoberfest until he moved to Visalia in 1991. **Boersma** provided history on the beginning of the event with the background of the late Hi-Noon Rotarian **Glenn McComas** who fell from a ladder and became a quadriplegic, unable to speak or breathe on his own without relying on a voice box. His fellow Rotarians at HNRC wished to support him when it became apparent **McComas** would need a devoted room in his home with specialized equipment and just to breathe. This was in 1982 and **Boersma** suggested an Oktoberfest. The two Carlsbad clubs began their continued cosponsorship of the event, raising \$9,000 the first vear. Hi-Noon used its half (\$4,500) to help McComas. "I want to commend all of you for keeping this tradition going", Boersma said. In the

beginning. Oktoberfest leadership had a theme: "EGBOK" which stood for 'Everything's Gonna Be OK'!
