MEETING OF October 16, 2017



President David Harrison opened the meeting of the Greatest Club in the Universe. Captain Father Ted Atwood, USNR, led the pledge. "Sunshine" Steve Mott led the signing of "God Bless America", accompanied by Bob Kreisberg on the Alto Saxophone. In honor of Columbus Day, for which the club was dark because it was the Monday following Oktoberfest, Mott lead everyone in the singing of "That's Amore", accompanied by Kreisberg on the Saxophone and Harry Peacock on the Clarinet. provided words of wisdom by reciting "Things I have Learned" by long time CBS 60 Minute Correspondent Andy Rooney.

Patty Johnson, filling in for Phil Urbina, reported on OKTOBERFEST; thanking all of those who worked the event on behalf of Urbina and his co-chair from the Carlsbad Rotary Club, Jeff Schafer. Club members and other volunteers worked 395 shifts to staff the event. Total funds raised of \$189,000: sponsorships \$55,350; gate sales \$81,000; advance ticket sales \$30,600; in-kind donations \$22,600. A total of nine charities will benefit from the proceeds this year. Johnson recognized the efforts of sponsor chair, Dave Kulchin, to make this a record year for sponsorships. Johnson also recognized the following for their leadership and dedication to putting on the event: Ken Clark, facilities director, Richard Weston, volunteer manager and coordinator, Julie Walker, entertainment and stage director, Jim Brubaker, permits coordinator and city liaison chief, Yvonne Finocchiaro, food manager, Joe Mc Dermott, non-profit/charitable organizations coordinator, President David, volunteer coordinator, Sam Ross, marketing director, LeAnn Rytz, advance tickets sale coordinator, and Bob Kreisberg, ambassador and director at large.



President David noted that with the current number of wild fires raging in California that, although our local area has not be impacted so far, the wildfire season will continue until the usual rains begin in late November to early December. He reminded club members of things that can be done now to prepare in the event of a fire. A key element to this is registering cell phone numbers with the City of Carlsbad to get the reverse 9-1-1 call that is used in case of an emergency. To sign up for this free service, visit

www.readysandiego.org. Other ways to prepare include: ensure there is defensible space around your residence and business, have an emergency kit on hand at home and in the car, program emergency contacts in your cell phone directory, be sure cars are fueled up as much as possible, do not engage in activities which can cause sparks during high fire threat periods. Finally, tune into AM 600, the local radio station, which provides emergency news and notifications.

Lisa Rodman announced the next Poker Party will be at **Jim Brubaker's** house starting at 6 pm on October 21.

President David noted there are several District Peace Initiative events coming up in the next several weeks and that **Joy Prowse**, District Peace Director, will be making announcements about these events at future meetings. Members are encouraged to attend at least one Peace event this year.

Rick Grove announced that Raising Readers with Rotary will occur at Jefferson Elementary School on Thursday, October 26 from 4 to 5pm to set up and on Friday, October 27 from 8 am to noon for the fair. Volunteers are needed to work this event (need about 6 people each day). Contact **Grove** if interested in participating.

President David noted that District 5340 is seeking nominations for District Governor for the 2020-2021 Rotary Year. Only current or past presidents of District rotary clubs are eligible so a note will be sent out to all CHNR past presidents. Anyone interested must be nominated by the club and that nomination must be filed with the District by November 7.

Bob Kreisberg announced that his former Rotary Club charters a 54 passenger bus each year to travel to Mexico to administer the polio vaccine to children. Past President Jim Brubaker is a 15 year member of Carlsbad Hi-Noon Rotary. He attended the first Carlsbad Citizen's Academy and was encouraged to meet all the members of City Council. When he met with Ann Kulchin and told her he wanted to be involved in the community she said, "Talk to my husband, Dave, about joining Rotary if you really want to be involved". Brubaker recalled his years of being a member of the Board of Directors and heading up Vocational Service when Walt Waggener proposed a

golf tournament as a fund raiser, the result of which was the creation of the Club's very successful Teens and Marines scholarship program. Brubaker noted that his year as President in 2011-2012 may be the most fulfilling year of his life and encouraged every member to take advantage of their avenue of service passion by getting involved. He noted that as a new member, Bruce Stewart immediately assigned him to do attendance so he got to know all the members very quickly and George Sullivan told him his first year that he had to work Oktoberfest and assigned him to a work crew.
