MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 17, 2018

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Various guests were introduced including former District Governor Janice Kurtz and prospective new members who are transfers from Rotary Clubs in Manhattan Beach and Hawaii. **Prowse** then led us in the Welcome Song.

JR Phillips reported on some of the early results of the Brewfest. More tickets were sold this year than in any previous year. Sometime in Mid-October the Committee will hold its formal de-briefing at the Discovery Center. All are invited to attend and specifics about date and time will be sent out to all members. Phillips stated that net profit from the event should be in the \$40 to \$50,000 dollar range, which includes a \$15,000 grant thanks to Visit Carlsbad, even though overall sponsorships were down this year. Both the breweries and guests are stating that this is the best event of its kind anywhere. In order to grow in the future the event needs to partner with other organizations, chasing sponsors is not a sustainable model. If we can sell the tickets the event will continue to grow because return business is very high. Once someone has attended one year they come back year after year.

Nancy Starling announced that the annual Halloween Party this year will be on Saturday, October 27, so mark your calendars now.

Jos Magana reminded all members to sign up to work Oktoberfest, either on-line or by using the list going around each week as we still need 150 shifts to fill to be fully

staffed at all positions. Beer and wine pourers who worked Brewfest will not need to take training before the event but for those who still need ABC training it will be conducted by the evening club before the event starts. You can pick up your 10 admission/meal tickets from **Josh Rytz** at the next two meetings and if you want to donate tickets for Marines to attend the event, give the tickets to **Dave Dana** by next week's meeting.

Patty Johnson announced that the \$5,000 matching grant to Oktoberfest which was in the works has been canceled because Carlsbad Rotary member **Frank Silva no** longer works for Nordson Corp. who was providing matching funds up to \$2,500. **Johnson** will contact all of the 23 Hi-Noon members who have donated to date to discuss their options regarding the donations they have made.
