- Community Service Providing hand-on service to organizations impacting the quality of life in Carlsbad.
   During the 2023-2024 Rotary Year this club:
  - Delivered Senior Meals to Carlsbad residents 5 days a week,
     52 weeks a year.
  - Volunteered at North County Food Bank packing food for those in need (once a month).
  - Volunteered at Brother Benno's serving meals to homeless (once a month).
  - Built 40 bikes for under-served Carlsbad Children.
  - Provided holiday gifts for 13 needy Carlsbad Families.
  - Planned and coordinated Rotarians at Work Day, a hands-on community support project.
  - Packaged 20,000 meals and donated them to North County Food Bank.

 Organized a book fair; built a pickleball court at a local middle school (built one last year too).

#### Middle School Level

 Supported students in the Rotary District leadership conference. Organized and implemented an essay competition. Coordinated adults visiting classrooms to discuss "What Grownups do for Work". Provided jazz band instruction. Provided summer school scholarships.

### High School Level

 Organized a Rotary 4-Way Test Speech contest, a Rotary Music Competition highlighting talented local youth, and a Model UN Program.

- Vocational Service: for the 2024-25 year we will focus on coordinating and executing the following.
  - AVID (Advance Via Individual Determination) Youth
  - RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards)
  - New Member Orientation
  - Scholarship Program (\$42,000 in 2023-2024)
  - Lunch and Learn Events for members.



- International Service Our International Service Program
  has been evolving. After years supporting a single, very
  successful, hands-on project in Mexico the decision was
  made to act more globally. While our impact on any single
  project may be limited, we have exercised our leverage to
  help make big things happen. In the 2023-2024 Rotary Year
  this club:
  - Helped fund a residency training program for a pediatric orthopedic surgeon in East Africa, and a water project in Ghana.
  - In Europe we helped support and rebuild a shelter/sanctuary for women and children refugees in Ukraine.
  - In Mexico, we helped support an event focused on over 400 disabled children.
  - And in Central America we helped fund a water project in El Salvador.
  - In 2024-2025 we intend to reengage in those same regions, in many cases working through our developed relationships with local clubs, extend into Asia in some small way, and will attempt to provide large scale support, though Rotary Grants, to mitigate serious mental health challenges in Ukraine and in Kampala, Uganda.
