


Challenges club to consider new approach for bulletin

Citing exhaustion, boredom, frustration and "nobody reads it anyway", the Editor and Publisher of the Old Mission Bell weekly bulletin, Ben Küllingsworth, has informed Old Mission Rotary Club President, Tom Basham, and other members of the board of directors that he will no longer publish a weekly bulletin.

Killingsworth said he has repeatedly asked for a volunteer to take over the editing and publishing duties, but so far no one has stepped forward. If no one does, and at this point it seems unlikely that anyone will, Killingsworth said he is willing to continue on a once a month basis, period, end of discussion.

However, instead of the usual bulletin, Killingsworth has proposed substituting a monthly publication more along the lines of a newsletter rather than a bulletin. The newsletter would look like the publication you are now reading.

The purpose of the newsletter would be to inform dub members about a variety of subjects. Included would be: a short paragraph about each program scheduled for the coming month; a short biography of two club members, one an old timer and one new member; a short article about one of the charitable organizations we support: space for a "Presidents Comer" which the club president could use for whatever purpose harshe desires and similar space for other club officers to use if they so desire.

There would also be articles about coming events, such as the District Conference; a brief discussion of the club's financial situation, i.e., how much money we have and anything of interest that the club treasurer wants to impart, and of course such critical information as a list of the club members responsible for bringing the drawing prizes during the coming month.

Gone would be information that many club members have characterized as completely useless, such as who gave the piedge of allegiance and the invocation, who led the singing, and who introduced the visitors and guests, etc.

Although current club president Tom Basham expressed surprise, saying he had hoped Kilingsworth would continue until the end of "his year", incoming president Bob Callicott gave his unqualified support for the idea, saying he was in complete agreement.

Bob Callicott Joined OMRC on August 4, 1955 - Eight of our members weren't born yet

Dr. Robert Callicott, M.D., was born in Knoxville, Tennessee on October 18, 1924. The youngest of three children, Bob attended a number of primary and secondary schools while he and his two sisters were growing up. Bob's father was in the wholesale cookie business, an occupation that must have provided certain advantages, if you count having all the cookies you can eat an advantage.

Bob attended Columbia Union College in Washington, D.C., then went on to Loma Linda University Medical School. It was there that Bob met Joy, who was studying to be a nurse. The next thing Bob knew they were married.


