Art Pratt Foundation Grant

On October 21, the Art Pratt Foundation of Old Mission Rotary presented an \$8000 grant to the City Heights Community Development Corporation (CHCDC). Development Director, Laura Ann Fernea explained that the funds will be used with other matching grants to buy a truck that will pick up food from the Feeding America Warehouse in Mira Mesa and deliver it to the residents of the City Heights community every week. In City Heights, one can find Hispanic, Northeast African, Near Eastern, South Asian and Southeast Asian immigrants speaking some 38 languages and 58 dialects!



Executive Director, Ken Grimes, explained that the City Heights Community Development Corporation strives to enhance the quality of life in City Heights by working with the community to create and sustain quality affordable housing, livable neighborhoods and foster economic self-sufficiency.

The Medical Minute



Dr. Kevin Glynn presented a very timely talk on the Ebola virus. The Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA) is expressing concern and attempting to inform physicians about the Ebola virus. A strongly worded commentary by a group including Dr. Paul Farmer criticizes the failure of both our government and us, the public, to provide sufficient support for our African brethren. In impoverished countries Ebola kills 70-80 percent of those infected. Yet low tech support, like fluids for rehydration, can save many of these patients. The world looks to us for leadership. We here in the U. S. can do better against this disease.

JAMA also contains a report that the World Health Organization is calling for tighter control of e-cigarettes. If these devices encourage young people to start using to-bacco, they will help create a new generation of nicotine addicts. In addition, other chemicals, including risky drugs, can be inhaled using e-cigarette technology, which should concern all of us.
