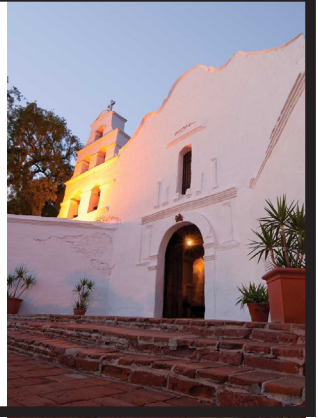

Art Pratt Foundation of Old Mission Rotary Humane Society Grant



Old Mission Rotary learned about the the San Diego Humane Society PAWS Program.

On January, 10th, the Art Pratt Foundation of Old Mission Rotary awarded a grant of \$4000 to the San Diego Humane Society. The funds will be used for a vehicle to help support the PAWS Program. PAWS San Diego helps people keep their pets by providing essential pet services and support to low-income pet families all over San Diego County.

In addition to delivery of pet food and supplies like flea medication, the In-Home Delivery Service provides vouchers to assist pet owners with veterinary bills, transportation to vet appointments for clients who are unable to get there on their own, and dog walking for home-bound and hospitalized clients.

Clients of the PAWS Program include seniors, people who are chronically ill and disabled, veterans, members of the military, and homeless individuals. As the largest pet safety net service in San Diego, the goal of this unique program is to keep pets in their homes and out of shelters.

Federal Aviation Administration (FAA)



Robert Reddeg briefed Old Mission Rotary on air traffic control operations in Southern California.

Robert Reddeg is an Air Traffic Controller at the Federal Aviation Administration in San Diego, California. Reddeg began working at the Federal Aviation Administration in 2008. He learned his craft in the Navy as an air traffic controller on an aircraft carrier.

The mission of the FAA is to provide the safest, most efficient aerospace system in the world. The FAA has many responsibilities but the primary task is to regulate U.S. commercial space transportation. The Southern California Air Traffic Control area is the busiest in the world. Some 275 air controllers control some 70,000 flights per day in the region!

Our speaker is a member and passionate advocate of the National Air Traffic Controller's Association (NATCA). The union is non partisan and their primary objective is to achieve a stable, predictable funding stream for the National Airspace System (NAS).

Rob remarked that the number of fully certified air traffic controllers, already at a 27 year low, fell again in the first three months of 2016.

Air traffic control is not for everyone and the training is rigorous Air traffic control is rock solid career with great pay and benefits. Rob asked us to pass the word along to bright young people!

We were delighted to listen to a man who truly loves his job!
