Workshops for Warriors


Hernán Luis y Prado is on a mission! The former Naval officer is tackling the problem of adrift veterans head on. Having served combat tours in Iraq and Afghanistan, Hernán watched with disbelief as men and women who had served in combat were discharged from the armed forces with no skills or support. He was driven to find a way to help these struggling veterans. Hernán also learned that there is a manufacturing skills crisis in the United States and he was inspired to set up a non profit to train and certify veterans for these high paying manufacturing jobs. Workshops for Warriors assists the transition of veterans and injured veterans into civilian life through mentoring, training, and education. The non profit provides a combination of classroom education, vocational training and work experience that empowers veterans and increases their career options, confidence, and self-respect. Instruction is offered by skilled veterans, active-duty service-members, and industry experts. Their programs work to ensure long-term independence and integration of veterans into the workforce

We were humbled to meet one of the students from the program, Mike Casey is a young Marine who lost a foot to an IED in Afghanistan. He was very enthusiastic and is looking forward to a career as a machinist thanks to the Workshops for Warriors program. Mike presented an American flag that was machined out of metal to President Steve

We enjoy many inspirational programs at Old Mission Rotary but today's talk was something special. Bob James is using his real estate appraisal talents to assist Workshops for Warriors expand their facility in Barrio Logan. Bob was so impressed that he invited Hernán to speak. We were inspired by Hernán who put everything on the line to finance his vision. Hernán praised his wife several times for her unwavering support.

Art Pratt Foundation

The Art Pratt Foundation Board of Directors has been busy! On January 14, two separate presentations were made by the foundation to familiar and very worthy causes. A check for \$9862 was presented to the Toussant Academy. This facility offers comprehensive services to homeless and runaway youth ages 14-18. They provide 35 transitional beds, specialized educational services and an array of social services. Their goal is to provide youth with the tools to become self sufficient. The grant from the Art Pratt Foundation will be used for new flooring on the first floor of their building at their downtown facility at Fifth and Ash.

The Art Pratt Foundation awarded The Glenner Memory Care Center with a check for \$6873 for furnishings. A grateful CEO, Anete Asher, joined us for lunch and took the opportunity to thank our club. The three San Diego County memory centers offer specialized, adult day programs Monday through Friday. Each center provides therapeutic activities and socialization in a safe, structured, family-like environment. Each person is involved in activities that keep them healthy and engaged.
